Easy Set Up

1. Download the eBill mobile app through your app store. Scan the QR code or search **eBill Mobile**.
 2. Once downloaded, enter the zip code of the area you receive GBT services at and click on the GBT logo that says **Golden Belt Telephone**.
 3. Next, enter in the username and password that you have set up for your GBT eBill account.
 4. If you have not set up an eBill account, click the **Register Here** button, where you will need to enter an invoice number and amount due from your most recent bill.

What are your work and non-work highlights this year?

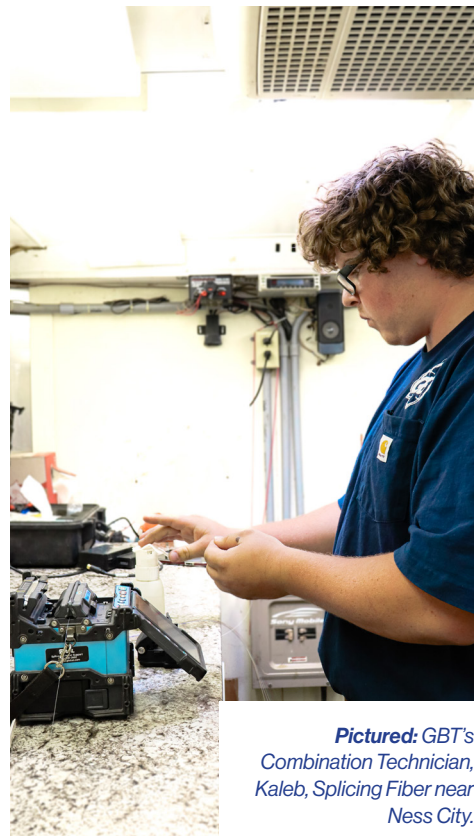

SPLICE, SPLICE BABY.

Alright, stop, collaborate and listen....to get a behind-the scenes look into how GBT technicians splice fiber to connect your home and all it's devices to the rest of the world!

Did you know that fiber is strands of glass that are designed to carry large amounts of data long distances, in a very short amount of time? So when a GBT technician is splicing fiber, they are fusing 2 strands of glass together using electric arc to produce enough heat to melt the fibers together. The quality of the splice is very critical to how well information can be transported where it needs to go. When splicing technicians have to make sure the fibers are not contaminated or have any foreign substances on them, so a clean environment is essential.

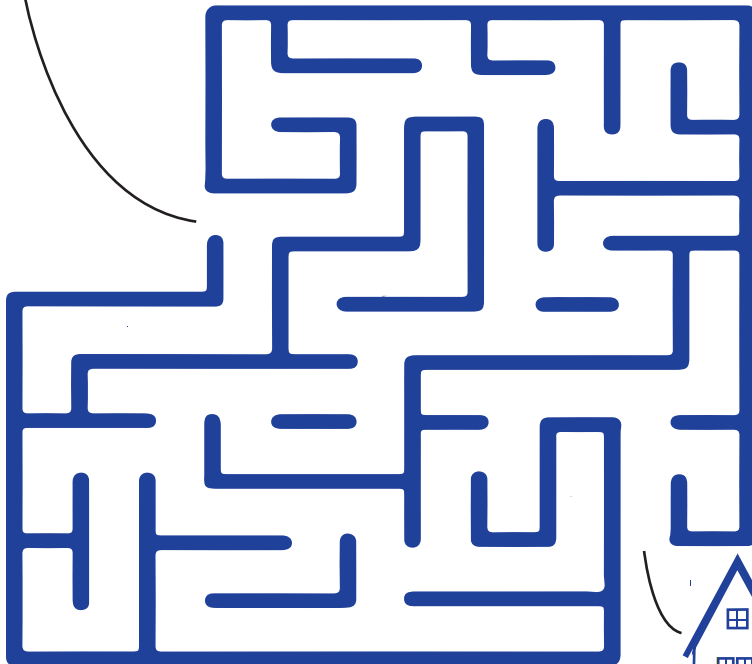

Recipe of the Month:

Chocolate Chip Cookie Ice Cream Sandwiches

Nothing beats the heat like cool ice cream - sandwich it between two chocolate chip cookie and YUM. We bet your mouth is drooling already!



Ingredients

2 sticks (1 cup) butter, softened
3/4 c. brown sugar
3/4 c. sugar
2 eggs
2 T vanilla
1/2 c. malted milk powder
2 c. flour
1 1/4 tsp. baking soda
1 1/4 tsp. salt
(12 oz) Mini Chocolate Chips
Vanilla Ice Cream

Directions: *Step 1:* Cream butter and sugars until fluffy. Add eggs and beat slightly. Add vanilla and beat until combined. Add malted milk until combined. *Step 2:* In a separate bowl, combine flour, soda, and salt. Mix it with wet mixture. Add chocolate chips and stir gently. *Step 3:* Bake at 375 degrees for 9 to 11 minutes on an ungreased baking sheet. Cookies will be flat. Remove to a cooling rack. *Step 4:* After cookies cool, place softened vanilla ice cream between two cookies. Wrap individually in Saran Wrap and freeze.
